The Students' Union Notes

The Students' Union notes that block learning is a new technique within the University of Suffolk, but there are aspects of it that raise concerns for a number of students. Many students that have additional responsibilities and needs are finding the new style of teaching inaccessible, due to the intense teaching style and closer deadlines.

The Students' Union Believes

The Students' Union believes that all students should have an equal opportunity to their learning and should have access to the same learning environment as their peers. With the lack of adjustments – other than that of the time frame of modules – to this new style of learning, students who have disabilities and additional needs are being disadvantaged.

The Students' Union Resolves

The Students' Union resolves that the sabbatical officers work with, and feedback to the directorate of learning and teaching and students' services to ensure that the student experience and the process for extensions is supportive and is equal for everyone.
